## WARRANT FOR ANNUAL MEETING OF THE EATON SCHOOL DISTRICT

To the Inhabitants of the School District in the Town of Eaton, County of Carroll, and State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote on District affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the King Pine Base Lodge, 1515 Eaton Road, in said District on Tuesday, the 20th day of April, 2021 at 5:00 p.m. to act upon the following subjects:

- **ARTICLE 1**. To see if the School District will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$912,987 for the support of schools, for the payment of salaries for school district officials and agents, and for the payment of the statutory obligations of the District. This article does not include appropriations voted in other warrant articles. (Majority vote required) (Recommended by the School Board 2-0-0)
- **ARTICLE 2**. To see if the School District will vote to discontinue the Tuition Expendable Trust Fund created in 2003. Said funds, with accumulated interest to date of withdrawal, are to be transferred to the general fund. (Majority vote required) (Recommended by the School Board 2-0-0)
- **ARTICLE 3.** Should Article 2 pass, to see if the School District will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$43,000 from Unassigned Fund Balance to be added to the Capital Reserve Fund for School Buses, established at the 1975 school district meeting, to be held in the custody of the Trustees of Trust Funds for the Town of Eaton. (Majority vote required) (Recommended by the School Board 2-0-0)
- **ARTICLE 4.** Should Article 2 pass, to see if the School District will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$30,000 from Unassigned Fund Balance to be added to the Capital Reserve Fund for Special Education, established at the 1987 school district meeting, to be held in the custody of the Trustees of Trust Funds for the Town of Eaton. (Majority vote required) (Recommended by the School Board 2-0-0)
- **ARTICLE 5.** Should Articles 2 and 3 both pass, to authorize the purchase of a school bus for the sum of \$99,000, with all funding to come from the Capital Reserve Fund for School Buses. (Majority vote required) (Recommended by the School Board 2-0-0)
- **ARTICLE 6.** Should Article 5 be defeated, to authorize the purchase of a school bus for the sum of \$99,000, with \$83,000 to come from the Capital Reserve Fund for School Buses, and the balance to come from general taxation. (Majority vote required) (Recommended by the School Board 2-0-0)
- **ARTICLE 7.** To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.
